This would be an excellent opportunity for an individual who wants to make a change and is passionate about social reform. The positions are unpaid and based in our London offices.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Provide research on a variety of legal and social issues.
- Management of social networking presence in order to provide online outreach and promotion of activities.
- Assisting in the drafting of grant submissions and project proposals.
- Keep up to date on relevant news and issues that may have an impact on LFJL's activities.
- Assisting with communication and the coordination of team members' activities.
